Leadership Opportunities

WORK PARTY - Saturday
Workers needed for this Saturday (10 October). Start time is 9:00 am.

The pistol and archery range fir siding arrives late this week. Two truckloads of mostly 20 foot long 1x4 and 1x12 siding needs to be moved into the storage barn and stickered so it will be dry and ready to install next spring.

The lifting is light, but there is a lot of wood (about 7000 board feet - 250 or so pieces of lumber).

We will have to move some stuff around in the storage barn to make enough room for the fir.

The more people, the easier the job, the faster it will go. The milling company is also delivering the wood strips for the stickers. They will have to be cut to length. Rich estimates 100s of stickers will be required (placed at four foot intervals). He recommends bundling a bunch together and cutting to length will a small chain saw. If someone has a small chain saw to cut the

FARR Projects Update

Pistol Range

Lots more progress this month. Thanks to Mark Julian for bringing his tractor in to spread out the gravel on the range floor. Thanks to the husky group below who (along with lots of help from Bob Davis and his tractor) placed 110 cement bags to block off the remaining open areas around the berm, finished raking the range floor gravel and cleared the berm back so we can grind the sharp edge on the T-1 steel deflector.



Remaining tasks that have to be done before we can shoot are listed below. Work parties will be called to finish all this as soon as possible.

- Grind the edge on the T-1 steel deflector
- Finish cutting the wall stud protector plates and drill the lag bolt holes (Steve Humphrey is hard at work on this one)
- Lag bolt the steel protector plates to the studs
- Fabricate the steel faced doors and hang them
- Install gutters on the berm roof and shooting area building
- Add firing line and safety line stripes on the concrete floor
- Hook up the telephone, add safety signs and first aid kit
- Re-install the gate
- Order sound insulation material and hang (my action)
- Install 4x8 plywood sheets to underside of berm roof

LEADERS NEEDED to setup and take charge of work parties. Please help out so we can start shooting again.

Clubhouse

We want to have an 80th anniversary celebration of our founding in December. There is lots of work to do to get our clubhouse ready. Rich Schmidt is leading the effort and NEEDS HELP! A partial list of tasks are listed below.

- Finish the second bathroom and fix other plumbing problems
- Install the heat pump, heater, air handler and ducting (Jay Smellow has been doing a lot of the carpentry work).
- Fix the gas stove installation (remove wall panels and add required thermal protection to walls and floor, install gas line - must do by Thanksgiving Dinner).
- Finish the gutters and install
- Re-do the front porch, add railings
- Move cedar siding from storage barn and stack/sticker fir siding for archery and pistol range buildings
- Finish the siding installation (later have to paint)

- Finish the new patio area
- Clean out the main room and make it presentable

Some of these tasks require some skill and others just need willing hands/back.
